Did You Know

In 1842 a mortgage was arranged to cover the legal costs of a court case resulting from trustees of the Willoughby Charities illegally evicting the village school master William Wilkinson. This ruinous episode resulted in a drain on the Charity's funds until the mortgage was finally paid off in 1918.

The Charities owned and rented out a number of cottages, including two in Thurlaston. The Trustees were always concerned about the cost of repairs and in 1916 the cottages in Thurlaston were sold off for £75 and the money invested in a fund to build more cottages in Willoughby. When the fund reached £1600 in the 1930's plans were made for four cottages on the land now used for the playing field. The cost of building an access road made the scheme too costly and the project was shelved, and so the land subsequently became the playing field that we enjoy today.
