Willoughby History Set


A dozen villagers gathered on the 20th January for the inaugural meeting of the WHS which provided some insights into the Village's development and the resources that are now available to further research it. It is clear that researching a family with village connections, or the development of a property or farm, can make a real contribution to understanding our Village's history. The same research tools can be used to further personal family trees too.

Having had an enjoyable afternoon further sessions are planned on the third Monday of the month between 10:00 am and 12:00 pm. The next meeting will be on the 17th February. Our time will be split between research into particular areas of interest using the technology now available in the Village Hall and discussion of topics suggested by members.

Willoughby Parish Council

There is a flyer with this edition of the Willoughby Monthly about the forthcoming Housing Needs Survey. The survey will be included with next month's edition. There is an obligation on Rugby Borough Council to carry out a Housing Needs Survey every 5 years. This used to cover just affordable housing but now covers all aspects of housing needs in the Village.

The Parish Council have been successful in obtaining a grant of £1,500 from the WCC Dunchurch Division Councillors Fund. This is for getting a Severn Trent water supply connection to the allotments. Further money will be needed to supply and fit pipework to water tanks on the allotments.

The Annual Fete in June is organised as a fun day for the Village and is run on a non-profit making basis just to cover costs. There have been suggestions in the past of things that could be included. If you have any ideas please let us know and they will be considered. Suggestions to Mike Thomas Please.

 Unfortunately dog mess continues to be a problem and is getting progressively worse. Please clean up after your dog and if you are aware of anyone who does not, then please let the Parish Council know and they will take the appropriate action. Not cleaning up after your dog can result in a fine of £50 or £1000 if the matter goes to court.

We have also had concerns raised by a local Vet about dogs not on a lead. They are dealing with more & more motor accidents involving dogs that have strayed into the road.
