Welcome to the October edition of the WM. September brought us some warmer weather. Paralympians in Rio inspired and our various organisations are back to their usual programmes after the holidays.

As mentioned last month the draft local plan produced by Rugby Borough Council (RBC) contains the prospect of massive development, initially adjacent to the Grandborough turn, off the A45. If the plan is not changed it is probable that there will be development all the way from Dunchurch to the Northamptonshire border if not beyond over time.

The consultation version of the plan was due to be published late in September along with some supporting documents relating to the Lodge Farm Garden Village these will be available to download from the RBC web site. It will then be possible to identify any valid planning objections and communicate them to the relevant parties. The campaign group Stand Against Lodge Farm Village will provide information about this and some draft letter texts you can use. Please attend their protest rally on the 1st October to provide tangible evidence of our objection to the proposal - more information about this inside.

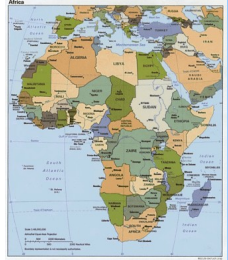

Tollgate Farm, Woolscott

A Public Protest Rally will take place at Tollgate Farm, Woolscott on Saturday, 1 October. Timing is 10.30 am for 11.00 am and ample car parking will be available. Tollgate Farm is located at the turn to Grandborough off the A45. You will see the signs advertising the event erected on the site. It is VITAL that everyone attends this Rally. Several members of your Committee have abandoned their holiday plans in order to be present.

The formal part of the Rally will be completed by 11.30 am and we are hoping that not less than 500 people will attend. If everyone brings 5 friends, we will get to 1000! We have invited the Press, the Radio and Television. Our Constituency MP, Rt. Hon. Jeremy Wright MP;QC, has confirmed that he will address the meeting. We request that you sign the Petition which will be available. This will be presented to an appropriate "dignitary" at some time during our campaign in front of the media.

Warwickshire County Council Highways have cleared some silt at the entrances to the culverts at the junction of Main Street and Lower Street. This is to enable an inspection of the culverts to take place. Following on from this Parish Councillors have cleared the brook of bullrushes by digging them up, this is to ensure they do not become a barrier for debris which could cause a blockage.

A copy of the Village Design Statement, The Emergency Plan and The Flood Action Plan together with a copy of the Prepare 4 Action booklet has been delivered to every household. Whilst there is a lot of reading, we hope you will find the information helpful and informative.

The drainage has now been installed in the Playing Field extension and the land levelled. The area will shortly be seeded and harrowed and then it has to be fenced off. Once the fencing is in place a new hedge will be planted where the old one was removed.

Library Books

The Home Delivery Library Service is a free service to those who are unable to visit or use their local library or Mobile Library due to ill health or infirmity.

Using volunteers, we deliver books to people in their homes once every four weeks, based on their personal preferences.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch
