SALFV

The Consultation period for the Draft Publication Local Plan ended on the 11th January. The latest proposals have generated more than 10 times as many objections as the previous iteration. No doubt Lodge Farm was the cause. The Government published a list of proposed garden villages, thankfully, Lodge Farm was not included.

SALFV, with its planning consultants, met with Councillor Timms and Mr. Back. The council agreed that 'Garden' is a misnomer and likely to be dropped making the proposal like any other (e.g. no necessity to provide local amenities). They also seem to agree the Sustainability Appraisal may be lacking (2 bus stops, broadband....) and are going back to their consultants to re-write it (however it is not clear whether this will involve the necessary re-appraisal or a coat of whitewash).

Neither the revised Sustainability Appraisal or the WCC Traffic Assessment were available before the close of the Consultation. The latter is expected around the beginning of February. We will not be given any opportunity to comment on either before the draft 'Plan' goes for consideration at meeting of all 42 councillors who may only look at a summary of the objections (prepared by those advocating the plan). Given the implications hopefully they will be more diligent and review the draft plan and supporting documents and apply the common sense that appears to have been lacking so far.

Willoughby Parish Council

Local Plan

Your Parish Council were invited to a meeting at the Council Offices with Rob Back the Head of Planning, Heather Timms the RBC portfolio holder for Growth and Investment and Vicky Chapman the Principal Planning Officer to discuss the Rugby Local Plan.

Mr Rob Back outlined the plan and your Councillors raised many objections to the proposed Lodge Farm development including the un-sustainability and lack of a proper transport assessment. It was clear that the meeting was a tick box exercise so that they could say they had consulted with the Parish Council, but we were not going to change their mind as far as Lodge Farm is concerned. It will now be up to the forty two RBC Councillors when they vote in March to either reject or approve the plan.

There is a further sustainability and transport assessment being carried out and your Parish Council believe it is important that the public and all consultees are able to see these and comment on them before the plan goes to the Council to be voted on.

First Responders

Sue Worthington and Linda Belgrove volunteered some time ago to be First Responders for the Ambulance Service. They have recently undergone training and become qualified and will be sent to situations as required by the Ambulance Service. This has taken up a lot of their time and will continue to do so. Our thanks to them for making the Community safer.

Watch out!! the fraudsters who use 'scam' emails are continuing to produce ever more realistic messages and in some cases are even using telephone 'cold' calls to add 'credibility'. Recent scams have involved HMRC, Amazon, PPI Claims, Boiler replacement.

Crime prevention: Smart water, a means of uniquely marking your property can be obtained via Rachel Settle. It is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being returned.
