Willoughby Parish Council

Further to the recent survey in connection with a Neighbourhood Plan for the Village, we had a response of 42.5% from the forms which were distributed to every house in the Parish. Of those responses 76% were in favour of a Neighbourhood Plan and there were nine Parishioners who volunteered to be on the Committee if the Plan proceeds.

At the Parish Council Meeting on the 8th of August the Councillors voted to apply to Rugby Borough Council for the designation of a Neighbourhood Plan based on the Willoughby Parish boundary. When and if we have received the approval from Rugby Borough Council then the process of formulating the plan can begin. This process can take 2 to 3 years.

On the morning of the 3rd of September I went to take the dogs for a walk at 6.15am and there were 15 dead ducks spread over the road beside the Village pond. They had not been run over but may have flown into a large vehicle. I picked them up and arranged for them to be collected by Rugby Borough Council. (Mike Thomas).

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

Recorded crime increased by 10% last year so it is more important than ever to take care of your property and, increasingly, to look out for fraudsters attempts to part you from your hard earned money. This is particularly the case if you use email and/or the internet where attempts are becoming more and more sophisticated.

The National Cyber Security Centre, a part of GCHQ, are providing advice to help you keep the baddies at bay on this web site: www.cyberaware.gov.uk. Good advice is also available from: www.getsafeonline.org. You will find the latest advice on creating a strong (not easily guessed or calculated) password and the importance of keeping the operating system and software of your devices up to date. It is also vital that you have anti-virus software that is up to date on all your devices.

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
