RBC Local Plan

The 'stage one hearings' of the examination of the draft local plan are due to end by Friday 2nd February. The Inspector issued a list of Matters, Issues, and Questions, a number of which focused on items many of us submitted representations about e.g. The sustainability appraisal of the Lodge Farm site. Several of these will have been considered in the initial days of the hearings e.g. The decision to drop Walsgrave Hill in favour of Lodge Farm. A whole day 31st January was set aside to deal with issues specifically to do with Lodge Farm. Hopefully the contributions of the SALFV experts and others will have convinced the Inspector that the proposal is unsound and should be removed.

The guidance notes issued by the Planning Inspectorate say that it will take 6 weeks from the Inspector finalising his report to its issue so it will be a few months, probably, before we know the outcome.

Please bear this in mind when you park. It would also be helpful if you do not block entrances to drives and try not to double park as there needs to be room for emergency vehicles to get through.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

There was a break in to a vehicle in the Village reported in January. It is a timely reminder that it is unwise to leave anything in your vehicle overnight. The villains are constantly prowling around looking for opportunities.

There have been lots of reports of fraudsters persuading people who are expecting to pay for work done or complete on a purchase, to change the bank details from those given by the contractor or supplier. In one way or another the tale they give is thathas changed their bank account therefore the payment needs to be sent to...... These scams vary in sophistication from the fraudster seeing a contractors van outside to hacking of a suppliers computer systems. Never change the payment details on the basis of an unsolicited call/message. Always check with the supplier on a telephone number you know to be genuine. Use a different phone if you can or make sure the connection has been broken from the suspicious call.

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
