Willoughby Society

After a busy first half to the year that seems to have flown by the Society has a break for a couple of months. There is the re-arranged canal trip on the 11^{th} of July for those who have booked a place.

We will shortly learn whether our bid for Live & Local shows, for the autumn and spring, has been successful. Hopefully we will be allocated a few of the excellent live shows on this year's menu. The scheme supported by the Arts Council and some local authorities has given us access to performers/shows that we would not otherwise be able to have in our small village.

PLANNING

 In May we received the welcome news that the Planning Inspector had told Rugby Borough Council that a large number of, so called, Main Modifications were required to the draft Local Plan in order for him to find that it is sound. These included the removal of the Lodge Farm Village proposal. Even with that being removed and several other reductions in numbers the draft Local Plan would deliver nearly 19% more dwellings than are actually required.

Subsequently it has been announced that Councillor Heather Timms has relinquished the Growth and Investment portfolio in the RBC Cabinet and that Mr Rob Back the Head of Growth and Investment had resigned. The RBC statement announcing these changes implied their departures had nothing to do with the mauling the draft Local Plan was given in the Public Hearings and the large number of Main Modifications needed to make it sound. It is certainly right that they have nothing further to do with planning in the area. Their complete failure to listen to residents or read and act upon their representations, many of which made the same points that the Inspector has, delayed the adoption of the draft Local Plan and at least for now has lost the desperately needed improved access and parking at Walsgrave Hospital.

2. It is clear that, if the current pressure to build more houses is maintained in coming years, it will be important to have a library of evidence containing detailed information about the natural and historic assets in our parish. Being able to produce such specific, local evidence would quickly demonstrate the impact of development at a particular site and should reduce the risk of having to fight battles similar to the Lodge Farm one in the future as well as supporting the Neighbourhood Plan.

Identifying 'Green Infrastructure' e.g. habitats and pathways that are used by animals of any kind is an important element of the library. The Draft Local Plan seems to assume this is restricted to watercourses, perhaps in the absence of reliable data. As the Neighbourhood Plan is developed there will be the opportunity to provide a more detailed and comprehensive map. However, to do that we all need to record the flora and fauna we have seen in the parish. There is a 'sighting' form on the village web site at

http://www.willoughbyweb.net/ws/ws-nn.html that can be used for the purpose. Don't worry if you can't identify something take a photograph and send a link to it in the sighting form. We can then find someone to identify it and let you know what you have seen. Knowing where, for example, Brown Hares, Hedgehogs, Purple Hairstreak Butterflies, etc. are seen or Skylarks heard will really help to make sure developers are not permitted to destroy centuries old habitats.

Willoughby Parish Council

Your Parish Council have arranged for the Rugby Play Rangers to come to the Village Playing Field and provide some play sessions for children during the summer school holidays. These sessions were very successful last year. They will start on Monday the 23rd July from 13.00 to 15.00 and run for five weeks.

We are also looking into the possibility of providing activities for older children and teenagers.

If there is anything else you would like your Parish Council to look into the possibility of providing, then please let us know.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

A warning has been issued by Action Fraud, the National Fraud & Cyber Crime Reporting Centre, about **fake text messages** purporting to come from EE saying a bill hasn't been paid and contain a link to a web page which is designed to get you to enter your log in details which would allow the scammers to steal your personal data. Don't click on any link in the message. Check your account from a different device or computer using your usual log in address not the one in the message.

There are a lot of reports of telephone calls along these lines "- Some money has been removed from a victim's bank account and staff at their local bank branch are responsible. Suspects have already been arrested but the "police" need money for evidence. " or "A business such as a jewellers or currency exchange is operating fraudulently and they require assistance to help secure evidence". The victim is then asked to withdraw cash or currency and hand it over to a courier to go for forensic examination. Banks and the Police never ask people to do this. Remember basic information, even mother's maiden name, can be easily found these days.

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
