Neighbourhood Development Plan

The Steering Group has spent a great deal of time analysing and thinking about all the comments and ideas we received during the Initial Consultation. We have now prepared three reports so that you know what is happening.

- 1. <u>Issues & Options Full Report (23 July 2018)</u>. This shows an analysis of the Yes/No questions and contains all the responses to other questions.
- 2. <u>Summary Report (23 July 2018)</u>. This will be delivered to every household in the parish as well as other interested parties. It shows the analysis of the Yes/No questions and tells you where you can read the longer reports.
- 3. Responses and Revisions Report. This document includes our responses to what you have told us and revisions we may make to the consultation document to produce the First Draft Neighbourhood Plan. It is extremely important to emphasise that, at the moment, all of this is very much a work in progress. We are acquiring additional evidence and information (often in response to your comments and ideas) and this may well influence what is included in the First Draft Neighbourhood Plan.
