## Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Following the consultation with you on the Issues & Options for the Neighbourhood Plan, work is progressing well on writing the First Draft NDP for another informal consultation with you. The Steering Group had planned to begin this consultation by the end of September but, in light of Rugby Borough Council's consultation on the Main Modifications to their Local Plan, we have decided to move it back a little so that the two consultations do not overlap.

Rugby's consultation ends on Friday, 5 October and we propose to begin ours on Monday, 8 October for four weeks. We will provide you with much more information nearer the time. As part of the consultation, we will be holding a second Neighbourhood Plan Day from 4.00 - 8.00 pm on Wednesday, 17 October, in the Village Hall. Please come. We want as many people as possible to know about what we are proposing and to tell us what you think.

The consultation on the Issues & Options was enormously helpful to us and we hope that you will give us your views again so that we can consider these before moving on to the next stage of the Neighbourhood Planning process. There are a lot of consultations but these are very important so that we eventually have a Neighbourhood Plan for Willoughby that reflects your views on how the parish should develop in the future.

## **RBC Local Plan**

Following the Hearings in Public the Inspector has required RBC to make a raft of 'Main Modifications' to the submission draft of the Local Plan. Notable amongst them are a number to remove policy DS 10 (Lodge Farm), others are technical to ensure the RBC Local Plan is consistent with the National regulations, and others are for clarity. However, because these amendments are significant it is a requirement that the resulting Local Plan and affected supporting documents are sent for public consultation. If you made representations previously you should have been notified of the new consultation.

All the revised documents are on the RBC web site along with instructions on how to make a representation. This time round you can only comment on the changes e.g. supporting the removal of Lodge Farm,
