The aim is to recognise and to protect the character of the historic agricultural landscape we live in. The Parish Council responses to the non planning items raised during the Neighbourhood Plan Consultation and Open Day are on the Parish Council web site. If you require a hard copy please let us know.

The Parish Council continue to press Warwickshire County Council Highways to clear the brook of vegetation from the corner of Lower Street to the pumping station. We are also trying to get WCC Rights of Way to deal with outstanding issues on some of the footpaths in the Village.

The consultation on the First Draft Plan is from 8 October to 4 November 2018.

A Summary of the Draft Vision, Objectives and Policies will be delivered to every household in the Parish during the week beginning 1 October. Inside there will be a short questionnaire asking what you think about these.

Many of the changes are based on what you told us during the first consultation and on further research the Steering Group has carried out over the summer. We are keen to improve the Plan even further so that with your help it truly reflects your views on future development in Willoughby.
