Neighbourhood Development Plan

The Regulation 14 consultation takes place for seven weeks from 21 January until 5pm on 10 March 2019. This is the first of two formal consultations on the Neighbourhood Plan and consultees will include not only residents in the parish and non-resident landowners but also all parishes in Rugby Borough and several in Northamptonshire, Warwickshire County Council, all councils that share a border with Rugby Borough, utilities companies, health trusts, Historic England, the Environment Agency, Natural England, the Highways Agency and voluntary organisations. Who would have thought there would be so much interest in Willoughby!

The Neighbourhood Plan has been updated and revised following the consultation on the First Draft Plan. You will all receive information about the Regulation 14 consultation during the week beginning 14 January and you will be able to comment by letter or online at https://www.willoughbyparishcouncil.org/neighbourhood-plan.
