Willoughby Cricket Club once again extends an invitation for new adult and junior players and social members to join them for what promises to be an exciting and interesting summer ahead.

2019 promises to be an exciting new chapter for the club as we have switched Saturday leagues for the forthcoming campaign. The club's two Saturday league teams will now compete in the **Northamptonshire Cricket League**, with the 1st XI beginning life in **Division 6** and 2nd XI starting off in **Division 13**.

Willoughby will also be fielding a team on a Wednesday in the **Rugby and District Cricket League (RDCL)**, plus will also offer non-league social cricket with their Sunday Development XI playing a series of friendlies with local village and clubs.
