Police & Neighbourhood Watch

There are ever increasing numbers of scams being reported. They all, by fear or persuasion, aim to convince you to send money to a bank account. Once there it is extremely difficult to recover. Don't be pressurised and ensure that you are dealing with the organisation you think you are. Do this by contacting them using contact numbers you already have or obtained from a reliable source – not the caller asking you to send money. If in doubt: search the names and numbers on the internet to see if there are 'victim' reports; and/or get help, check with Trading Standards or the police.

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
