#### Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The Inspector's final report on the Rugby Local Plan was published on 7 May. Some minor changes were made to our Neighbourhood Plan so that references to the Local Plan are correct.

The Neighbourhood Plan was submitted to Rugby Borough Council (RBC) on 16 May and will go to the Cabinet on 24 June to request approval for the final consultation. The consultation is carried out by RBC and will take place for 6 weeks from 24 June. Everyone who asked to be kept informed should receive information about the consultation and how to respond, if you would like to do so.

Once the consultation has finished, the Neighbourhood Plan and all the representations received during it will go to an independent examiner who is likely to make further changes. During their examination, the independent examiner will review all of the documentation produced during the formulation of the plan, including previous responses to consultations, to satisfy themselves that the plan they are examining has taken people's views into account. As always, we will keep you informed about what is happening.

#### Police & Neighbourhood Watch

Every week is bringing more reports of scams involving claims of outstanding payments to well known organisations e.g ....your direct debit for your TV licence has been cancelled...... the messages/letters include links to payment pages. The accuracy of the reproductions of the genuine organisations web pages etc. is increasing. The golden rule is if in any doubt at all don't respond to the message/letter contact the organisation using a number you know is genuine.

**Crime prevention:** Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
