Neighbourhood Development Plan

The final consultation on the Willoughby Submission Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) started on Tuesday, 25 June and will run until Tuesday, 6 August 2019 inclusive. Rugby Borough Council (RBC) is responsible for carrying out this consultation and everyone who asked to be kept informed should have received information about the consultation and how to respond. The Submission NDP and its accompanying documents are available online and on paper.

After the consultation, RBC will send all the documents and responses straight to an independent examiner who will write a report. If the examiner recommends that the NDP should proceed to a referendum, then this is likely to take place sometime in the Autumn. The referendum will ask local people whether or not they would like RBC to use the Willoughby NDP to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area.
