Leam Valley Community First Responders (LVCFR)

Our Volunteer First Responders provide invaluable help, after a 999 call for medical help has been made and before the arrival of an ambulance or paramedics. Living in areas, like ours, a long way from ambulance stations/hospitals this may be be quite a long time. The volunteers are trained by the Ambulance Service but are required to raise funds to cover their costs and buy some equipment.

To raise funds they have joined the Rugby Lotto which supports local causes. You can buy tickets from the Leam Valley First Responders page:

Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Rugby Borough Council (RBC) has appointed Andrew Ashcroft as the independent examiner for our NDP. Mr Ashcroft has extensive experience in neighbourhood planning. This includes a leadership role in a council where many neighbourhood plans have been successfully adopted, carrying out a wide variety of examinations, being involved in preparing a neighbourhood plan as a steering group member. Through his work he has developed a real interest in and awareness of rural planning issues in general and the specific need to sustain villages in a positive and sensitive fashion.

Mr Ashcroft has provided a 'route map' outlining the key stages for his examination.
