**Welcome to the November edition of the WM.** Unpredictable weather plagued us last month, including for the Grand Opening of the restored telephone box.

The date has been set for the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) referendum, 2<sup>nd</sup> December. The Steering Group provide more information on the back page. The referendum is the final stage of the NDP process. A majority vote in favour of adopting the plan will result in it becoming a part of the RBC Planning considerations when assessing applications. The bigger the majority in favour and the higher the turnout the clearer the message to borough councillors that the policies in the NDP are important to us and that we expect them to be respected. This will help prevent unacceptable proposals, like the Lodge Farm plan, being put forward.

The Willoughby Society hold their AGM later in the month (27th), an opportunity to find out what they have been up to and a couple of days later light classical group Fordante will visit us again thanks to support from the Arts Council England.

There is a flyer for the Over 60s annual lunch accompanying this issue and inside there is news of the New Year's Eve Party.

Please send your vote by post or come to the Village Hall between 7am and 10pm on the day. Rugby Borough Council (RBC) will send all registered voters in the parish the necessary information beforehand.

The referendum will ask you whether or not you would like RBC to use the Willoughby NDP to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area.
