**Happy New Year and welcome to the January edition of the WM.** Since the last WM was written: we have had lots of rain resulting in flooding in Main Street, thankfully no properties were inundated; one referendum with an uncontestable result; and one election also with an uncontestable result. Let's hope 2020 is a more positive and progressive year.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan was finally adopted by RBC after the referendum result in favour of it being used to help determine applications for development in the Parish. It has been a long slog for the steering group but they can be satisfied that their efforts have reached a successful conclusion and they have made a real contribution to ensuring our Parish evolves in a sensible way in the coming years.

In the middle of last year the WM included an item about our First Responders and the requirement that they raise funds to cover their own expenses such as uniforms, equipment, and travel costs. The Rugby Lotto provides a means to give them regular support and have a chance of winning a prize. At this time of making resolutions a simple one would be to sign up to buy one or more tickets each week. Tickets are just £1 each and half goes to the nominated cause, i.e. the Leam Valley First Responders and a further 10% is shared amongst all the causes in the scheme. Two tickets would give over £50 to our First Responders. The time taken by ambulances in an emergency can be critical. ### Neighbourhood Development Plan Referendum

The referendum of local people was held on 2 December 2019. The result was as follows:

Electorate: 337 Ballot Papers Issued: 173 Turnout: 51.3%

Number of people who voted Yes: 169 (97.7%) Number of people who voted No: 4 ( 2.3%)

The turnout was high for a neighbourhood plan referendum and we would like to thank everyone who took the time to vote. The decisive Yes vote is particularly pleasing as so many people in the parish contributed to the plan.

### **Adoption by Rugby Borough Council**

On 17 December 2019, Rugby Borough Council formally 'made' (adopted) the Willoughby Neighbourhood Plan. This means that, in accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations, our neighbourhood plan formally became part of the Local Development Plan for Rugby Borough and will be used by the Council to help decide on applications for planning permission within Willoughby Parish.

#### **Police & Neighbourhood Watch**

Action on Fraud have reported recent instances of people being telephoned by a person claiming to be a police officer and told their bank account has been compromised. They are then persuaded to draw their funds in cash and hand it to a 'courier' who will put it in 'safe keeping' for them. No matter how convincing such a caller may be the Police will never ask anyone to withdraw money and ask you to give or send it to them. If you get a call like this report it as soon as possible.

**Crime prevention:** Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
