#### Willoughby Cricket Club

Hand sanitiser at the ready as cricket is back at Willoughby CC

After several months delay to the start of their 2020 season and a nervous wait to see if any play would be permitted at all, cricket is back on the sporting agenda at Willoughby.

The release of new guidelines for recreational cricket by the ECB made it a busy week of final preparations at The Green to make the club deep cleaned, safe and with new distancing procedures and one-way systems in place around the pavilion. The use of changing rooms and the traditional mid-match sit down for tea may be off the menu for now to be replaced by regular sanitation breaks to player's hands and cricket balls, but that is a small inconvenience for everyone to have the opportunity to take to the field once again.

Willoughby now have an abridged Northamptonshire County League (NCL) season for the next two months. The club's two Saturday sides will still compete in 40 over matches against teams in their own divisions but in a 'World Cup' style format, leading to a 'Last 8' knockout stage to decide the mini-tournament winners. And some will have to set their alarms as all games over the coming two months or so are scheduled to have 11.00am starts in order to fit in with the regular mandatory sanitation breaks.

There is midweek cricket with a shortened Wednesday Night League schedule, plus WCC's Sunday friendly programme still remains largely intact until the end of September.

Where junior cricket is concerned, there are league and friendly fixtures for our Under 13 and Under 15 teams, plus weekly coaching sessions for all our junior cricketers aged 8 to 16.

#### DOORS OPEN AGAIN AT ADULT EDUCATION CENTRE

We've learnt a lot in recent months with many of us using unplanned extended time at home to discover new skills or re-discover old ones.

Rugby's Percival Guildhouse, Warwickshire's only independent adult education centre, has been on the same journey. The charity, forced to close its doors in March when Lockdown struck has, in common with so many households, embraced Zoom.

Thanks to the tireless efforts of its staff, for the first time the Guildhouse has offered classes online during June and July, thus maintaining contact with its students at a critical time.

Plans are now underway for the re-opening of the Guildhouse on 28th September, when more than 70 courses will be on offer ranging from Italian, Spanish, French, German and Japanese language courses, to a good mix of Arts and crafts. To safeguard students, most courses will be run on a blended basis with some places in-house and others joining virtually. Guildhouse Chairman, David Dove, says: "The charity was set up a century ago to provide professional, tutor-led adult education to the local community. I'm proud we've kept doing that and look forward to welcoming folk back into our St Matthew's Street home in September."

Work is also progressing on plans for the facilities in church and once they are completed the necessary permission can be applied for with tenders. Once that is in place grants can be sought.

In order to secure a future for St Nicholas as a church serving the community we have to progress with this work. It is a challenge even more so because of the events of the last few months.

The churchyard is being kept mown and tidy for people to visit and walk round.
