At Leamington Hastings Academy we have had a great start to the academic year, the children have settled back in brilliantly and are really glad to be back at school. Over the summer break, the school playground has been resurfaced. This was possible due to half of the cost being met by donations from members of the community and fundraising events. We would like to thank everyone that attended the Young Farmer's gin evening, local community groups such as Birdingbury and Willoughby, and everyone who attended school fairs and other events that were held to raise money. We are extremely



grateful. We are looking forward to having playground markings installed for the children to use, once the tarmac has cured for the appropriate amount of time.

We are currently receiving requests from parents to tour the school either for Nursery places, or for Reception places for September 2021. Due to Coronavirus arrangements we need to carry these visits out in a different way this year. We are happy to show you around the school fully after the children have left the building, or if you would like to visit during the school day we can show you inside the school and classrooms can be viewed from the doorways. Alternatively, we are happy to video chat with you. As you would expect, all children from Reception to Year 2 are taught by a qualified teacher. More unusually, our Nursery children are taught by a qualified teacher too! Do get in touch if you are interested in any places.

Thanks to the reopening of the village Hall we are able to restart our meetings this month. Fellow member Jim Rowley will be telling us about 'Recorders' (musical not judicial!!) on the 28th October. There are specific requirements to be met to comply with the rules and regulations designed to protect us all from Covid 19. In particular we will need to manage numbers and arrival at the Hall so that there is an even flow rather than groups arriving together. Face coverings will be required at all times when not in your seat. Please use the hand sanitiser on arrival and departure. As increased ventilation is required warm cloths are advised!! Finally the Hall kitchen is closed at present so there will be no refreshments but you are welcome to bring your own. Richard will write to all members with details and how to reserve your place early in October.

Obviously, if the Covid 19 rules and regulations change we may need to modify our plans, or in a worst case scenario cancel them. If this is the case we will email all members as soon as we can.

Finally please adhere to the 'hands, face, space' requirements and the one way system at the Hall designed to keep us all safe. Please do not attend any event if you are feeling unwell, have tested positive or been contacted by NHS Test & Trace and required to self isolate.

Provisional arrangements have been made for a live performance by the **Kiriki Trio** on Saturday 5th December. The current numbers limit for the hall is 30 which is insufficient to be viable. However, we do have the option of having two slightly shorter than usual performances to both comply with numbers limits and have sufficient capacity for a viable event. The trio are part of the Kiriki Club which is described as "a stellar line up of multi-instrumentalists, *Kiriki Club* make the party happen. Rooted in vintage sounds and styles, *Kiriki Club* mix 40's/50's jumpin RnB with exotic sounds from around the world and surprising versions of pop classics". This is a Live & Local show so on past experience it will be good.
