There has been a problem recently with dog mess in the Playing Field. Dogs are not allowed in the Playing Field under any circumstances.

You are permitted to walk your dog through the Playing Field extension where the goal nets are as long as you keep your dog on a lead and stick to the footpath. Should your dog mess whilst walking the footpath please ensure you clean it up.

It is law that you should clean up after your dog wherever this occurs. There is a lot of dog mess around the Village which is unacceptable so please act responsibly and clean up after your dog.

The Parish Council have arranged to have the Rugby Borough Council Play Rangers come to the

Village again for sessions during the summer months subject to no COVID-19 restrictions. There will be more details to follow in the coming months.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

https://actionfraud.police.uk hasn't reported any 'new' scam trends in the last month or so but that is no reason to relax. Fraudsters will keep looking for opportunities to steal our hard earned money. They are expected to try to take advantage of the rush for tickets to major concerts and events as COVID restrictions are lifted – make sure you deal with legitimate ticket sellers and if booking online lookout for search results that go to a site that looks like the genuine one but the web address is wrong e.g. a letter is changed or for example xyz.co.uk becomes xyx.co.uk, or something like anyweb.com/xyz.co

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items. Contact her (see below) to arrange to take smaller items to her or a home visit, in the village, to mark larger items.
