Willoughby Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) - Review

The NDP was made (approved) on 17 December 2019 by Rugby Borough Council. As a result, the NDP is now used to help determine planning applications in the neighbourhood area alongside Rugby's planning policies and national policy. Although there is no requirement to do so, the Parish Council undertook to review the NDP every two years to ensure that it remains up-to-date.

This review has now taken place and after a thorough analysis of planning applications over the past two years and the implications of the new National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) published in July 2021, the Parish Council and Rugby Borough Council (RBC) have agreed that there are only minor modifications needed to the plan to bring it up-to-date e.g. referring to the new 2021 NPPF, adding new housing and amending bus services. The policies remain the same. The Modified NDP and the Schedule of Changes will go to a meeting of the full Council at Rugby on 15 December for consideration. If agreed, the Modified NDP and the Schedule of Changes will be published on RBC's website and on the Parish Council website.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

Crime prevention: Property marking is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being recovered. Rachel has the Village property marking kit and can mark items.
