Help needed! Refreshing the Amenity/Memorial Garden (behind the phone box)

Can you donate bulbs or plants? The aim is to re-develop the garden into a Sensory garden with the central feature being a Fraser fir Christmas tree that can be decorated each year.

An application for funding has been submitted but we may not be successful. Whether we are successful or not we still aim to transform the garden into a beautiful place where you can sit for a while whilst out walking, meet up with friends, or where you can just sit in quiet contemplation amongst beautiful scents and sounds of nature.

If you are going to divide any bulbs, corms, or plants in your garden and have some to spare, or if you have a surplus plant that could be incorporated into the garden. Please offer them to the this project

The plants needed are strongly scented perennial plants and shrubs; Shrubs and plants that attract bees and other insects; Herbs; and Plants that have a sensory feel. Examples we would like to include are are:- Forsythia, Buddlea, Lilac, Ceonothus, Mock Orange, Mahonia and Saraccoca (Sweet Box). Astrantia, Stocks, Sweet William, Heuchera and Lupins. Ornamental Grasses. Lambs Ear and Rose Campion. Bulbs inc; Daffodills, dwarf Daffodils, Anemone, Tulips, Hyacinth, Snowdrops, Crocus and English Bluebells
