An intrepid group stayed outside and colonised the marquee for the afternoon.

Willoughby Parish Council

Play Rangers - the Parish Council has arranged five sessions with Rugby Borough Council's Play Rangers during the summer holidays. These sessions are free and are great fun. They are for children aged from 3 to 13 years old although children under eight years old must be accompanied by an adult. The sessions will be held on the village playing field or in the village hall, if the weather is wet. They are from 12:00 until 2:00 pm on Mondays:

25th July - Nature Explorers;

1st August - National Play week: 8th August - Mad Science:

15th August - Mini-Olympics; 22nd August - Water Play.

Alongside the construction work we have a lot of Heritage Activities and Events scheduled as part of the overall project. Including




