#### **Play Rangers**

The Parish Council has arranged five sessions with Rugby Borough Council's Play Rangers during the summer holidays (one has already taken place). These sessions are free and are great fun. The activities are mainly focused for 5 to 13 year olds but no one gets turned away. Children under eight years old must be accompanied by an adult. It was great to see lots of people at the Jubilee events. The Society was instrumental in providing a Village Flag Pole (and Jubilee flag) and also in arranging the Big Lunch, our 10th. Our efforts also included:

## **Festival Day Races**

Unfortunately we were not blessed with good weather this year, after so many sunny days in recent weeks it decided to start raining at about 12pm and kept on until nearly 4pm. The question was whether to attempt to hold the races in persistent rain or abandon them altogether this year. Fortunately my helpers Val and Pat together with a number of parents press ganged me into starting and the result was very enjoyable for everyone who took part or watched. There were no Obstacle Races due to the conditions but the races went ahead reasonably problem free with few fallers. David Thomas, from Flecknoe, kindly agreed to present all the medals, he is the farmer who supports us every year by providing bales of hay for the obstacle course.

As usual the races were keenly contested and a number of children did really well and won a few medals, namely Emmie, Evie, Annabelle, Noah, Evangelina, Izzy, and Oriana. Overall runners up were Tilly Nunn and James Hall who both won 4 medals. This year we had 2 new trophies and the champions were Emily Hiscox for the girls who won 5 medals and Sam Taylor for the boys who won 4 medals but also won in the tug of war; however, in a show of wonderful sportsmanship, he insisted on sharing the trophy with James Hall. The adult winner was Heather Hiscox who performed really well and also had the time to help me prepare everyone for the races. We also gave medals to children who had not won any races because taking part deserved one! The Tug of War shield was shared by the two ladies teams who were very evenly matched, but we had a clear winner in the men's event. In spite of the bad weather, it turned out to be really enjoyable for everyone involved. It is amazing how resilient children are and I thank all the families who supported the races with their participation and attendance. My thanks to everyone who helped me on the day, particularly Pat Atkins, Val Taylor, Val Hall and Heather Hiscox.
