Willoughby AED Volunteers

You could do something amazing in our village - like save a life! We are lucky to have two defibrillators with public access in Willoughby and a small group of volunteers trained to use them. In the event of WMAS getting a 999 call of a suspected cardiac arrest locally, in addition to despatching an ambulance they also instigate an automatic telephone "ring around" to our group of volunteers in the hope that one of us is available to pick up the AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) and offer assistance until such time as the paramedics arrive. This can be vital in saving a life. We need a few more volunteers to swell our numbers so if you think you could help out, please get in touch with me, Kim Taylor, on 07771 908434 or email kimtqhf@gmail.com and I can talk you through everything. You would receive training in CPR and use of the AED of course and there is absolutely no

obligation to be available and/or respond if contacted so the more volunteers, the better. Please give it some thought and get in touch - you might just save a life.

A New Stagecoach Bus Service for Willoughby

From Saturday, 15 April, Service D1 is to be rerouted through Braunston via Willoughby and Longdown Lane to rejoin the route at Barby. This service runs hourly between Rugby and Northampton via Daventry. The new route will include the following stops in Braunston/Willoughby Willoughby Main Street (A45), All Saints Church, The Green, Ashby Road and South Close.
