### St Nicholas Church

We hope you have had time to se the wonderful work our conservation builders have done on the church. Most of our external build work is complete. We still have the buttresses and west window to have rendered. Internally some ceiling repair work and redecoration of damaged areas both north and south aisles is all that is left of the National Lottery Heritage work.

In addition we are hoping to be able to get the plaster of the north aisle walls repaired and redecorated where damage has occurred. It makes sense to do this whilst we have the scaffolding in place to save costs later on. We are still facing a shortfall for this part of the work despite a grant and donations. All our fund raising is being channelled into this and we will get as much as we can completed. People have been so generous giving up time and supporting us. The final stage of work is due to start end May and through June. Completion beginning July. It will be lovely to see the church emerge from all this upheaval.
