Upgrading Street Lighting to LEDs

You are invited to the meeting on Tuesday, 14 November 2023 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall where you can hear what is being proposed and give your views. The report prepared by Jo Jarman, our Parish Clerk, will be posted on the website and a link provided on Facebook. Paper copies will also be available at the meeting.

Visit by Councillor Dale Keeling on 30 September 2023

Dale is Willoughby's representative on Rugby Borough Council. During his visit, parish councillors walked and drove round the parish pointing out issues we would like him to follow up for residents. These included the state of footpaths, funding to upgrade the street lighting, highways issues on Main Street, Moor Lane and Woolscott Road, completion of the Woolscott Road lights and flooding issues. Cllr Keeling has confirmed that he has followed up on all these issues.

Review of the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The NDP is reviewed every two years to ensure it remains up to date. A schedule of minor modifications has been produced in collaboration with Rugby Borough Council and the planning consultant who supported us in developing the original plan. These modifications mainly update census information and references to the new national planning framework published in September. The policies remain the same. The modified NDP will go to a Rugby Borough Council meeting for approval in due course.

Flood Action Group FLAG

FLAG is in contact with Warwickshire - Highways and Flood Risk Management Team - asking them to carry out work to improve the flooding situation in the village. At present, the focus is on two issues: getting the tarmac at the Lower Street junction lowered so that water can flow away down Moor Lane and having silt and bulrush rhizomes removed from the culverts and brook. This is a work in progress! Locally, there are 12 flood wardens who will do all they can to support residents in the event of serious flooding and we ask residents with riparian ownership to be sure your section of the brook is cleared before winter to help the flow of water. The group has produced a leaflet for residents about what to do in a flood situation and Bert Ogle, the Chair, has written a short, informative report on the impact of flooding on residents.
