Upgrading Street Lighting to LED

At the Parish Council meeting on 14 November 2023, the Street Lighting Upgrade Report was accepted in full and it was resolved to seek approval for the borrowing of £15,000, repayable over a 10 year period, from the Secretary of State (Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities). The street light upgrade will be self-funding from the savings on electricity and maintenance of the existing lights. There will be no increase in the Precept relating to the upgrade. Once approval has been received, it is proposed that the quote for £19,675 + VAT be accepted, Electricity Network Contractors be appointed to carry out the work; £4,675 be paid out of reserves.

Review of the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The modified NDP is on the agenda for approval at the Rugby Borough Council meeting to be held on 13 December 2023.

Councillor Howard Roberts - Resignation

We are sad to report that our representative on Warwickshire County Council, Cllr Howard Roberts, has resigned due to ill health. The Parish Council would like to thank him for the support he has given Willoughby in the past. A by-election will take place in December.
