Upgrading Street Lighting to LED

The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities has approved the loan for £15,000 from the Public Works Loan Board. Electricity Network Contractors Ltd has been awarded the contract. The necessary work should take place early in 2024. As noted before, the street lighting upgrade will be self-funding from the savings on electricity and maintenance of the existing lights.
