

She is a Pagan goddess of Germanic origin and associated with spring and the dawn. She was considered important in Anglo-Saxon and Old High German traditions and is believed to be the namesake for the Christian festival of Easter. She is associated with themes of fertility, renewal, and the changing of the seasons, as her name is originally linked to words related to dawn and the east, where the sun rises. She is often depicted with symbols of spring, such as eggs and

hares, which have become integral elements of the modern Easter celebration. However you choose to celebrate, I wish everyone a happy Easter.
