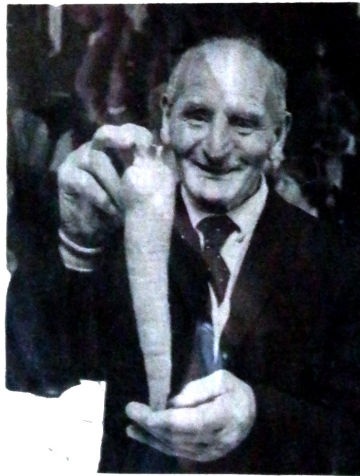


Willoughby snow makes £64

Willoughby's flower and vegetable show was very well attended this year and made £64 which will go towards the village hall fund. The cup winners were as follows: The Pemberton Cup for the most points overall in
