WEIGHT of the largest bell 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ cwt in F.

In 1724 a set of chimes were installed , being bought from Southam , and on the hours of 12 , 4 and 8 pm played the following tunes;

"Cannon, Suffolk, New Court, Belle Isle March, Captain Turners March and a French tune". This chiming apparatus has recently been restored.
