As part of the celebrations for the Village Hall's Diamond Jubilee, a committee comprising of members of various organisations within the village has been formed to plan a major event. Proceeds from this event going to the Village Hall and the Church.

The following has been proposed:-

An "OPEN VILLAGE" weekend, with various aspects of our village being open to visitors.

The dates chosen for this event being SATURDAY 24th and SUNDAY 25th JULY 1993. The duration of the day's events have not yet been fixed, but may stretch from 11.00am until 6.00pm on both days.

It is envisaged that the following attractions would be available:-

- 1. Village gardens "open" for public viewing.
- 2. A Flower Festival in the Church.
- 3. Display of local Arts and Crafts.
- 4. Display of Village Archives.
- 5. Cake and Produce stalls.
- 6. Refreshments.
- 7. Free parking.
- 8. Cricket match (Friday night July 23rd)

This event is new to Willoughby, and its success would depend on the willingness of village inhabitants to take part in the running of it, eg. open their garden to the public and/or assist in arranging and stewarding events etc.

1. Village gardens "open" to the public.

Quite simply this means that as many gardens as possible would be open and available for viewing by visitors, (there would be a sign outside to indicate this).

It should be noted that fears of hordes of people running riot through your flower beds or stealing cuttings from every bush are completely unfounded. It has been proved that visitors attending have a genuine interest in other people's gardens (o.k, they may also be nosey!) and respect your property.

Gardens do not have to be large, landscaped, or in immaculate condition to be of interest to a visitor, indeed the most interesting gardens are usually quite small and simple.

Anyone offering to open their garden will be visited before the event to answer any queeries.

2. Flower Festival in Church.

This event is already well under way with designs etc having been drawn up. It is probable that the Flower Festival would also be open on Monday 27th July.

3. Display of local arts and crafts.

It is hoped that villagers would loan arts and crafts that they have created for staging and displaying in the Village Hall over the two day event.

These would be stewarded during the event to prevent loss and handling. Security of items would be given priority.

4. Archives display.

A selection of Archive photo's depicting the past history of the village will be displayed in the Village Hall, being of interest to villagers and visitors alike.

5. Cake and produce stalls.

It is hoped that cakes, produce, plants etc would be donated for sale on these stalls (to be situated in or around the Village Hall)

6. Refreshments.

Available from the Village Hall on both days of the event.

7. Parking.

FREE parking will be available in fields on the edges of the village, thus leaving the limited "on street" parking for residents.

It is possible that the Village Hall car park would be utilised for Disabled car parking. Police advice is beeing sought on these matters.

8. Cricket Match.

A celebration cricket match is being arranged for Friday night, 23rd July.

Programmes.

Admission to the gardens would be by programme (charges not yet decided) purchased at free car parks or other key sites in the village.

To offset the cost of printing programmes, local businesses (within the village) are invited to purchase advertising space on the back page.

The event, although only four months away, has not yet been fully organised, and any ideas that you think may be of use would be welcomed.
